# THE BILL GUTSHALL CREED SPEAKER AWARD

In his memory the Chillicothe FFA Creed speaker will receive a \$100 for demonstrating their ability to speak up and look others in the eye while representing the FFA chapter as the Creed Speaker for this year.

#### GROZINGER FARM MANAGEMENT AWARD

The Grozinger family will present a plaque and a \$200 check to the outstanding senior Farm Management student.

The award is based on class grades in Agriculture Education, scores on the Farm Management contest, and general knowledge of production agriculture.

### SAVAGE MEAT AWARD

# Year In Review May 1, 2021—April 30, 2022

Chillicothe FFA, with the help of our Agriculture Communications class, will highlight some of our Chapter's awards and accomplishments through our "Year in Review Report." Here are some of the chapter's accomplishments: The chapter received 1st in the state for Model of Innovation in Strengthening Agriculture, was 26th out of 351 chapters in the state for the Chapter Activity Award, had 100% membership chapter, they also received the Gold Emblem award and received a 3-star ranking at the 94th National FFA Convention. Claire Walker was elected as the Area II Vice President and, Abbey Hayen applied and interviewed for a State Office. This year we were able to get back to normal and have a traditional FFA Barnwarming. \$49,256.96 (2<sup>nd</sup> Highest total EVER) was earned for chapter operations at Barnwarming. Twenty-five members competed for eleven fall speaking spots. At the area level ten gold ratings were earned. Nine speakers moved onto districts and two speakers competed at the state level. Eighteen members competed in the local Creed and Division I Prepared Speaking Contest. Our chapter also had a successful contest season. The chapter fielded ten District Career Development teams and fifteen Leadership Development Events. Livestock (5th place state-group I rating), Conduct of Meetings (5th place state-group I rating), and Parliamentary Procedure (2<sup>nd</sup> place state-group I rating). Prepared Speaking division I, Ag Sales (group II rating), Farm Management (group II rating), Knowledge (group I rating), Poultry (group II rating) and the Soils (group II rating). Fifty-two students received their MOASK IRC certificates through participating in CDE competitions. One member was selected to perform at the Missouri State FFA Convention with her talent and one member was selected to perform in the FFA Chorus. The chapter had thirty-five members participate on the Chillicothe FFA Trapshooting team. The A squad placed 1st at Area with AA Squad placing 2nd. In the first ever NW District FFA Trap Shoot the AA Squad placed 1st and won the MYSSA Overall Spring Break 'Em and the Trap shooting team competed at the spring State Trap at Linn Creek. SAE projects have led our students to several accomplishments. There were sixteen members that received their American FFA Degree, fifteen members that received their State FFA Degree, and we had over 100 members that received their Greenhand, Chapter and Area FFA Degree. Thirty-six students competed at the area level for proficiencies, and eleven were recognized at the state level. Austen Minnick was the state winner in Landscape Management. Joshua Eckert was selected as the Area II Star in Placement and Kolby Singer was selected as the Area II Star Farmer. Eighty-seven members exhibited their SAE project the Livingston County Fair, seventy-five exhibitors at the Missouri State Fair where Chillicothe FFA was recognized as the winner of the Governor's cup, five livestock exhibitors at the National Livestock Shows. Chillicothe FFA members participated in all the activities that they could at the local, area, district, and state levels. The Washington Leadership Conference was canceled for the 2021 summer. We had thirty-six members attend the National Convention trip this year. The Chillicothe FFA was excited to host activities where people could come and watch or participate in which included; 392 members and spectators attended mud volleyball, with twenty-seven teams; 250 members and guests

attended Barnwarming; two members attended MABA; one member attended HYPE, and four members attended HYMAX all of these camps/ activities were finally back to being in person. Six members attended Farm Bureau Leadership Day in Jefferson City. During the 2021-2022 year the Litton Crusaders Program held numerous activities, such as picking and delivering pumpkins, with pumpkins donated by Donnie and Sandy from Chula. The pumpkins were delivered to all classes at Bishop Hogan. Litton Crusaders also held a "Life on the Farm day," where kids from CES Kindergarten classes and Parents as Teachers program participated in pedal tractor races, face paintings, retriever training, live animal viewing, and a fun lesson on how and why we ear notch piglets. Litton Crusaders along with the Beck family held a field trip for 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders to Beck's farm. The Litton Crusaders described how farms work, were able to take home plants and sample beef jerky. The Litton Crusaders went to CES where 1st graders planted marigolds and came to the Litton Campus for a tour of the school farm.

### State FFA Degrees Awarded

On March 2, 2022 it was announced that fifteen members of the Chillicothe FFA Chapter received their State FFA Degree, in Columbia, MO on April 22, 2021. Chillicothe had the most State Degree recipients from one chapter, out of 351 chapters. Before receiving this degree they had to meet a number of qualifications and fill out an application that followed their SAE and leadership skills.

Chillicothe FFA had the highest number of State FFA Degree's of any chapter in the state of Missouri.

The state FFA Degree is the highest degree that the Missouri FFA Association can give to its members. This degree is awarded to the top three percent of the total State FFA membership each year who have met the following qualifications:

- 1. Have received the Chapter FFA Degree.
- 2. Have been an active FFA member for at least two years (24 months) at the time of receiving the State FFA Degree.
- 3. While in school, have completed the equivalent of at least two years (360 hours) of systematic school instruction in agricultural education at or above the ninth grade level, which includes a supervised agricultural experience program.
- 4. A student after entering agricultural education must have: A. earned and productively invested at least \$1,000; or B. worked at least 300 hours in excess of class time; or C. a combination of thereof, in a supervised agricultural experience program.
- 5. Demonstrate leadership ability by:
- a. Performing ten procedures of parliamentary law.

- b. Giving a six-minute speech on a topic relating to agriculture or the FFA.
- Serving as an officer, committee chairperson, or participating member of a chapter committee.
- 6. Have a satisfactory scholastic record as certified by the local agricultural education instructor and the principal or superintendent.
- 7. Have participated in the planning and completion of the chapter Program of Activities.
- 8. Have participated in at least five different FFA activities above the chapter level.
- 9. Have participated in at least 25 hours of community service, within at least 2 different community service activities. These hours are in addition to and cannot be duplicated as paid or unpaid SAE hours.

# Chillicothe FFA Barnwarming

On Saturday November 6, 2021 the Chillicothe FFA held its annual Barnwarming festivities. We were able to have a "Normal" Barnwarming this year with the dance being held inside the Jenkins Expo. Activities included a dance, games, and the coronation ceremony. This year the 2022 Barnwarming King and Queen were Josh Meservey son of Steven and Christie Meservey, Joshua Eckert son of Rick and Becky Eckert, and Ellie Barnett daughter of Brent and Iill Barnett. #### DAVID and NANCY MINNICK FFA SCHOLARSHIP

- a student owns the piece of equipment. • Abbey Hayen- Diversified Crop Production-Entrepreneurship-Member owns an enterprise or business that applies the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market crops from two or more of the following proficiency areas: grain production, fiber and oil crop production, forage production, specialty crop production (excluding floriculture production), vegetable production or fruit
- production. • Kolby Singer-Diversified Agricultural Production-Entrepreneurship/ Placement- Involves the use of the best management practices available to produce and market a combination of livestock and crops in two or more proficiency areas. These areas include at least one species included in Diversified Livestock and at least one species included in Diversified Crop proficiency area.
- Ethan Cooper- Environmental Science and Natural Resources Management-Entrepreneurship/Placement-Students receive practical experience concerned with the principles and practices of managing and/or improving the environment and natural resources. Activities may include the areas of management of agriculture waste (excluding common compliance with EPA regulations) recycling of agriculture products, environmental cleanup, land/wetland reclamation, serving in the conservation corps; managing agricultural energy usage (not for building or maintaining), multiple uses of resources, land use regulations pertaining to soil, water, and air quality, preservation of wet lands, shorelines, and grasslands, erosion prevention practices; public relations and education concerning pollution; installing subsurface drainage, public relations and education concerning pollution. Projects that solely install/maintain drainage tilling systems belong in agricultural services.
- Claire Walker- Ag Communications Entrepreneurship/Placement-Includes programs in which a member is placed at a newspaper or other agricultural print (such as magazines) facilities to obtain training and practical experience in writing and publicizing in preparation for a writing communications career. Programs may also be at radio and TV stations, fair media rooms, or other businesses requiring speaking skills and knowledge of agriculture. The

student may also own and produce an agricultural-related broadcast or show. This area also includes any use of or development of social media or new technology aimed at communicating the story of agriculture.

- Carson Crawford- Ag Sales Placement Entrepreneurship- Member owns an agricultural enterprise or business, not covered in a more appropriate proficiency award category. This could include sales of feed, seed, fertilizer, agricultural chemicals, agricultural equipment, machinery or structures. Enterprises could also include the merchandising (buying an item with the sole purpose to resell it in a short time frame) of crops, livestock, processed agricultural commodities, horticulture products (including quarry rock for decorative or landscape purposes), floriculture (including the creation of floral arrangements), and forestry items at either the retail or wholesale level.
- Jaycie Stimpson- Dairy Production-Entrepreneurship- Member owns an enterprise or business and applies the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market dairy cattle, including the raising of breeding animals for dairy purposes (i.e., bulls and heifers), and raw dairy cattle products. This award area also includes enterprises in which a member leases cattle for dairy production.
- Austen Minnick (1st Place)- Landscape Management Entrepreneurship/ Placement- Member owns the enterprise, or works for a business that includes experiences with planting and maintaining plants and shrubs, landscaping and outdoor beautification, grounds keeping, sprinkler installations and lawn mowing/care services, portions of the project can include hardscaping and the installation of decorative rock, etc.
- Landon Winder-Swine Production-Entrepreneurship- Member owns an enterprise that applies the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market swine and their raw products.
- Carter Crawford- Forage Production Entrepreneurship/Placement- Member owns the enterprise, or works for a business that includes the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market crops for forage such as alfalfa, clover, brome grass, orchard grass, grain forages, corn and grass silages, all pastures and sorghum (not used for grain). NOTE: Custom bailing activities more appropriately fit in the Agricultural Services award area.
- Joshua Eckert-Turf Grass Management-Entrepreneurship/ Placement- Member owns the enterprise, or works for a business that involves the planting and maintaining of turf for outdoor beautification, providing a lawn mowing service that does not include installation or maintenance of additional landscaping, sod produced for sale and sport field or golf course management.

On April 21, 2022 at the Missouri State FFA Convention, Austen Minnick placed first with his proficiency.
