

FFA Members Receive Honors at Annual Banquet

Nearly \$13,000 in Scholarships Awarded

The activities and accomplishments of Chillicothe FFA members were highlighted during the 2006 Chillicothe FFA awards banquet and ceremony at Gary Dickinson Performing Arts Center Saturday night. An estimated 196 agricultural education students of Chillicothe's chapter, which includes the chapters of Hale and Bosworth, attended, along with their parents, family members and friends as well as numerous award sponsors. Approximately \$13,000 in awards and scholarships were presented to FFA members Saturday night.

The top award of the evening - the Jerry Litton Memorial Award, a \$1,500 scholarship - was presented to Tyler Way. This award is given annually by Mildred Litton who, with her late husband, Charley, started the scholarship in 1979. The award is given in memory of their late son, Jerry, a former Chillicothe FFA member and officer who went on to be a national FFA officer and, eventually, a U.S. congressman. He died in a plane crash in 1976. The scholarship is based on the applicant's evidence of a strong potential and capability as demonstrated in FFA, school and community activities, as well as plans to continue and expand their formal education. John Cook, president of the Chillicothe R-2 Board of Education, presented the award to Way.

New this year was the Chet James Scholarship which was awarded to two seniors who are planning to pursue a career in the conservation field. The James family sponsored that award, which consists of \$350 each. Tisha Nibarger and Abby Sallee were the recipients of that award.

Also new this year was the Herb Albertson Award which was awarded to Madison Pulliam. The \$330 cash award is presented to a graduating senior based on his or her future plans to complete a four year degree in agriculture or other related field. The award is sponsored by the Albertson family.

The Charles Surber Livestock Award which consists of a plaque and \$100 check to be given to an FFA member who will keep livestock for the first time at the Litton Agri-Science Learning Center was also presented during the evening. The late Charles Surber was a past Chillicothe FFA member who believed strongly in FFA and the positive influence that it has in the lives of young people. He believed this so strongly that he and his family agreed to sell the property on which the Litton Center is built and he was a major contributor in the initial fund drive for the center. Andrew Thomas and Dustin Merrill received this award.

Among all of the awards presented were the Bank Midwest, Chillicothe State Bank and Annual Agribusiness awards. Bank Midwest presents a trophy and a \$75 check to a member of each of the four classes based on the total amount of points earned by each member for participating in the different FFA activities during the year. Recipients were Jaimie Baker, Jamie Cunningham, Allie Peters and Gabby Gates. Chillicothe State Bank presents a trophy and a \$75 check to the outstanding member of each class based on quality and scope of the members' knowledge of record keeping and management. Recipients of this year's awards were Tyler Dietzschold, Morgan Quinn, Geana Gates and Keyona Renzelman. The Agri-Business Awards, consisting of \$75 checks, were presented by Chillicothe Animal Hospital, Dr. Ross and Dr. Gwin to one individual in each class based upon leadership, participation, career development and FFA goals. This year's recipients were Camie Griffin, Derrick Norman, Kourtne Parks and Mary Beth Reid.

The Reed family presented a trophy and a \$75 check to each of the two Star Greenhands and the two Star Chapter Farmers. The Star Greenhand Award is given to an outstanding first-year student in both the agri-business and the production agriculture program, and the Star Chapter Farmer is given to second-year students in both areas. The award is based on scholarship, leadership, S.A.E. program and participation. This year's recipients were Star Greenhands Ben Radcliff and Meredith Jones, Star Farmer Jaryn Black, and Star Agribusiness Zac Ireland.

Baker Takes First in State FFA Public Speaking Contest

The Missouri FFA Association awarded Jaimie Baker, of the Grand River Tech FFA Chapter, first place in the FFA Prepared Public Speaking Division 1 Career Development Event at the 78th Missouri FFA Convention. Baker's advisers are Jim Grozinger, Keith Dietzschold, Todd Jones, Brian Thompson, Matthew Trussell, Roger Wolf, Ron Wolf and Leda Schreiner. Fourteen students competed at the state level.

Division 1 Prepared Public Speakers deliver a three-to-four minute speech based on an agriculture topic they have selected and researched. The contestants present their speech in front of a panel of judges and then undergo an additional three minutes of questions. The judges base their decision on the information presented, the student's knowledge of the subject, the delivery of the speech and the answers to the questions.

MFA, Inc. and the University of Missouri College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources sponsored the event and plaques. The Missouri FFA Association has more than 23,000 members. More than 7,000 FFA members and guests attended the annual Missouri FFA Convention April 20-21 in Columbia. LOUISVILLE, KY – Trish Judy and Kim Maberry, members of the Chillicothe FFA Chapter, recently received the American Degree. Earning the degree means Trish and Kim are of a select group of individuals to be recognized for years of academic and professional excellence. The honor was presented on October 29, 2005 at the 78th National FFA Convention, held in Louisville, KY.

The American Degree recognizes demonstrated leadership ability and outstanding achievements in agricultural business, production, processing, or service programs. To be eligible, members must have earned and productively invested \$7,500 through a supervised agricultural experience (SAE) program in which they start, own, or hold a professional position in an existing agriculture enterprise. Recipients must also make it their mission to demonstrate outstanding leadership abilities and community involvement.

Each award recipient receives a gold American FFA Degree key, certificate and a wallet ID card. Of 476,732 FFA members nationwide, Trish and Kim were ones of the over 2,900 to be recognized in 2005. BASF, Case IH, The Farm Credit System and Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc. as a special project of the National FFA Foundation sponsor the degree recognition program.

Tyler Jones National FFA Award Winner to Tour Costa Rica, Gain Perspective of Global Agriculture

LOUISVILLE, KY—Tyler Jones was selected to attend a trip sponsored by the National FFA Organization to Costa Rica.

As the agricultural community becomes increasingly global, it is crucial that young people considering careers in the industry understand the opportunities and challenges of international trade. A group of 46 national FFA award winners, 5 FFA Advisors and 4 national FFA staff will tour agricultural sites in Costa Rica this summer and compare the industry in Central America and the United States. Following an orientation session in Miami on June 19, the group will depart for an 10-day tour. “The global marketplace can be a difficult concept for students to grasp. Visiting agribusinesses and talking to industry experts in Costa Rica will help students see the similarities to U.S. agriculture and better understand how what happens in Central America can have implications back home,” says Larry D. Case, national FFA advisor. “Costa Rica is an ideal agricultural tour site because it includes some of the most diverse agriculture and geography in the world, and is small enough that the group will be able to see most of the country during the trip.”

Seminar participants were selected from national agricultural proficiency award finalists and American Star Farmer and Star in Agribusiness finalists named last November at the 77th National FFA Convention in Louisville, Ky. The seminar, in addition to cash awards and plaques, is made possible by business and industry contributions to the National FFA Foundation.

During the seminar, students have an opportunity to truly experience global agriculture and culture of Costa Rica. The international seminar is an education study seminar designed to introduce the award participants to agriculture as it is practiced in other countries. Participants will be visiting farms and agribusinesses and have the opportunity to experience living with families from Costa Rica.

The Fiber and/or Oil Crop Production – Entrepreneurship/Placement Award is one of 50 proficiency program areas FFA members can participate in to develop valuable experience and leadership skills at the local, state and national levels. Jones became eligible for the national award after winning the Missouri State FFA competition earlier this year.

This award is sponsored by Helena Chemical; Syngenta Seeds Inc.; United Soybean Board, as a special project of the National FFA Foundation. In recognition of being a finalist, each of the four finalists will receive a plaque and \$250. The national winner received an additional \$250 during a special ceremony at the National FFA Convention.

A fifth generation farmer, Tyler Jones started his entrepreneurship SAE with ten acres of soybeans. He also helps work the family farm that consists of 2600 acres of soybeans. He also has a growing cow/calf pair operation.
