

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
Local Students Compete at Missouri State FFA Agriscience Fair

Lauren Haley and Marissa Surber both of Chillicothe, MO recently competed in the Missouri FFA Agriscience Fair.

Lauren Haley was awarded first place in the senior division of Animal Systems for the project titled: The Effect of Weaning Age on Feed Consumption and Rate of Gain in Goat Kids.



Marissa Surber was awarded second place in the freshman division of Plant Systems for the project titled: *The Effect of Soil Location on Bioremediation of Contaminated Soil.*

Lauren's abstract to her Agriscience project is as follows: "The purpose of this experiment was to study the effect of weaning age on feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. Weaning can be a management practice that will affect

the profit of the producer. Weaning allows the producer to control the feed intake of his animal and evaluate the growth of the animal as well. People use varying guidelines as they make decisions about weaning. Some use the standard 90 day age while others wean earlier or use weight to determine when to wean. The control in this experiment was 90 day weaning, traditionally the time when kids are weaned. This experiment was done on thirty nine goat kids in the same environment, vaccination history, and feeding program prior to the experiment. The independent variable in this experiment was weaning age. The dependent variables in this experiment were feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. The amount of feed consumed by each group was measured each day and then added together to determine the total amount of feed consumption over a seven week period from the age of 55 days to 90 days. Each kid was weighed when they turned 60 and 90 days old to determine their rate of gain. The results in this experiment showed that weaning age does have an impact on feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. The 60 day weaning group had the highest feed consumption while the control (90 day) weaning group had the lowest. The control (90 day) weaning group had the highest rate of gain while the 75 day weaning group had the lowest. The results show that the hypothesis was supported by comparing the 60 day and control (90 day) weaning groups and the 75 day and control (90 day) weaning groups. The hypothesis was not supported when comparing the 60 and 75 day weaning groups. The null hypothesis stating total feed consumption and rate of gain will not be significantly different between weaning groups must be accepted when comparing groups 60 day and 75 day weaning, but can be rejected when comparing groups 60 day and control (90 day) weaning and 75 day and control (90 day) weaning. Recommendations for further study would be to study earlier and later weaning ages. The effect of gender as it relates to weaning could also be studied."

Lauren will be sending her project to the national level where it will be judged. At the national level, the top 15 will be selected to compete for a national ranking at the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana, in October of 2013.

Marissa's abstract to her Agriscience project is as follows: "The purpose of this experiment was to study the effect of soil location on the bioremediation of contaminated soil. The hypothesis was if pre-contaminated soil is used during the remediation of soil, then it would decrease the most amount of oil. The control in this experiment was no soil. The constants in this experiment were amount of soil, amount of nutrients, amount of water, air circulation/ oxygen levels, amount of oil added to soil, temperature, and amount of light. The independent variable in this experiment was location where soil is found. The dependent variable in this experiment was the bioremediation of soil. This was tested by how much oil is reduced from a sample of the soil in a set amount of time, determined by the diameter of a grease spot measured in centimeters. The results in this experiment were that the soil found in a leaf litter area (timber) reduced the most amount of oil. The corn field soil came in second and the pre-contaminated soil reduced the least. The control variable (no soil) had very little oil reduced at all. The results show that the hypothesis was not supported and instead, 'pre-contaminated soil' reduced the least amount of oil eating bacteria. Recommendations for further study would be testing pre-contaminated soils from different locations and possibly the effect of nutrient level on activity of oil-eating bacteria."

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26th Annual Missouri FFA and High School Trap Championships April 27, 2013

LINN CREEK, MO - More than 85,000 shots rang out from the Missouri Trapshooters Association home grounds in Linn Creek on April 27, 2013 for the 26th Annual Missouri FFA and High School Trap Championship. More than 850 students from all over the state participated. "Despite the rainy weather, we saw several perfect scores and many 99s," said Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) Education Outreach Coordinator Eric Edwards, who helped staff the event. "We even had to have a shoot-off to decide placement in some divisions because of all the 100-out-of-100 scores these kids put up today." "The dedication of these young people amazes me," said Edwards. "Some are here just to have a good time and socialize with other kids from around the state, while others get very serious about the competition aspect. We had several shooters who will be going to college next year on full-ride scholarships to compete on a collegiate level in the shotgun sports." He added, "These outstanding youth along with their dedicated coaches, show that not only is Missouri a great place to hunt and fish, but a great place to enjoy shooting sports too!"

The student's scores were Orren Beck 94 out of 100, Brandon Bothwell 99 out of 100, Ben Burtch 92 out of 100, Taylor Daly 85 out of 100, Matt Dupy 87 of 100, and Zach Quinn 82 out of 100.

Proficiency Award Winners

The following students received first place in the Area 2 proficiency award selection. These students competed at the state level against fifteen other area contestants.



Paige Peters - Ag Communications - Includes programs in which a student is placed at a newspaper or other
agricultural print facilities to obtain training and practical experience in writing and publicizing in preparation for a
writing communications career. Programs may also be at radio, TV stations, fair media rooms, or other

businesses requiring speaking skills and knowledge of agriculture. The students may also own and produce an agriculture related broadcast or show. This area also includes any use of technology aimed at communicating the story of agriculture.

- Brandon Bothwell Ag Sales Entrepreneurship Student owns the enterprise or business, not covered in a
 more appropriate proficiency award category; may include enterprises such as: the sale of feed, seed, fertilizer,
 agricultural chemicals, agricultural equipment, machinery or structures. Enterprises may also include the
 merchandising of crops, livestock, processed agricultural commodities, horticultural, floriculture, or forestry items
 at either the retail or wholesale level.
- Lauren Haley Agriscience Animal Systems Research (1st Place) Research into the study of animal
 systems, including life processes, health, nutrition, genetics, management and processing through the study of
 small animals, aquaculture, livestock, dairy, horses, and/or poultry.
- Colby Ruoff Diversified Crop Production Placement Student works for a crop producer that applies the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market crops from two or more of the crop related proficiencies such as: grain production, fiber/oil production, forage production, specialty crop production, vegetable production, or fruit production.
- **Timber Ballantyne Food Science & Technology -** Student owns the enterprise, works for a business that provides experience in the applying microbiology and biochemistry or food product development to improve taste, nutrition, quality and/or value of food. Programs could include the development of new products, food testing, grading and inspecting.
- Colton Moore Forest Management & Products Includes the best management practices available to conserve or increase the economic value of a forest and/or forest products through such practices as thinning, pruning, weeding, stand improvement, reforestation, insect and disease control, planting, harvesting, Christmas tree farming, Forest Service, making and selling cedar shakes and firewood, and wood chips/mulch.
- **Jami Loney Grain Production Entrepreneurship (2nd Place)** Students owns an enterprise or business that applies the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market crops for grain production such as corn, barley, millet, buckwheat, oats, grain sorghum, milo, wheat, rice and rye.
- Cyrsten Lollar Turf Grass Management (2nd Place) Involves the planting and maintaining of turf for outdoor beautification, providing a lawn-mowing service, improvement of recreational areas, sod produced for sale, and sport field or golf course management.
- Anthony Peniston Vegetable Production (1st Place) using the best management practices available to efficiently produce and market crops such as beans, potatoes, pumpkins, sweet corn, tomatoes, onions, zucchini, all canning vegetables, and all common garden vegetables.

Anthony and Lauren received first place in their divisions and will be moving on to the national competition in October of 2013 at the National FFA Convention. Cyrsten and Jami both received second place in their divisions and will be considered alternates to nationals.

Today's farmers grow more food and do it with fewer resources than any time in history. Consumer demands have changed over time, but farmers meet those needs by providing an increasing variety of goods. According to the United States Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service, technology and innovations in agriculture allow one US farmer to provide enough food and fiber for 154 people around the world. Even amidst the current grow-your-own environment, most people have little contact with the source of their food supply. Most consumers rely on others to produce some or all of what is needed. Statistics show farm families make up about 2 percent of the US population, yet they provide for themselves and the other 98 percent.

Grocery shelves are filled with an overwhelming number of food product choices. On average, nearly 40,000 different items appear in most shipping establishments. Restaurant menus boast a variety of items from which to choose. However, many people fail to connect the dots to realize farmers are the source of their supply of food, says Sherry Jones (Livingston County Farm Bureau President). Farmers provide an abundant, affordable and healthy food supply. Consumers in the US spend less than 10 percent of their disposable income on food, based on USDA figures. That amount is less than any country in the world. Other items we use daily come from agriculture. Whether it is personal care products, medical items, school supplies, printed materials, sports equipment, manufacturing or construction, agriculture products are in the mix. "Seldom do we stop and ask ourselves, 'where did this come from'? says Sherry Jones. "Farmers and what they provide should not be taken for granted."

"Ag in the Classroom" was the topic of a teachers workshop hosted by Livingston County Farm Bureau on Wednesday, October 3, at the Litton Agriculture Campus. Diane Olson, director of Promotion and Education for Missouri Farm Bureau, conducted the hands on workshop to assist teachers in finding resources to help them bring agriculture into their classrooms. She also helped teachers to connect these resources to Grade Level Expectations and the Common Core Standards. Resource materials are available for preschool through high school grade levels.

In coordination with the "Ag in the Classroom" workshop, a special awards presentation was held to recognize 10 Livingston County teachers who received Mini-Grants for the current school year. The Missouri Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture is committed to promoting a better understanding of agriculture. The Mini-Grant program for educators is one example of this commitment. Missouri educators applied for funding to assist them as they infuse agricultural messages into the classroom. This program is a unique opportunity to enhance agricultural literacy - one teacher, one classroom and one student at a time. The money provides resources, consumables and hands-on experiences to help connect students and teachers to agriculture.

This marks the 15th year for this competitive granting process in which educators may receive a maximum of \$250 for classroom projects. Twenty-eight grants were funded this year. "It's exciting to read the project proposals and the creative ways teachers are planning to include agricultural messages," said Diane Olson, director of Promotion and Education Programs for the Missouri Farm Bureau. "Due to limited resource budgets, teachers often rely on their personal resources to enhance their classroom curriculum. This funding provides necessary resources to include agricultural messages."

They also watched a slide show featuring Area II Greenhands, listened to the National FFA Officer, Alicia Hodnik, speak, and were presented their Greenhand pins.

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
Barnwarming 2012 11/03/12

Another Great Year for the Chillicothe FFA Barnwarming!


