# **State Trap Shoot**

LINN CREEK, MO - More than 85,000 shots rang out from the Missouri Trapshooters Association home grounds in Linn Creek on April 26, 2014 for the 27th Annual Missouri FFA and High School Trap Championship. More than 850 students from all over the state participated. "Despite the rainy weather, we saw several perfect scores and many 99s," said Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) Education Outreach Coordinator Eric Edwards who helped staff the event. "We even had to have a shoot-off to decide placement in some divisions because of all the 100-out-of-100 scores these kids put up today." "The dedication of these young people amazes me," said Edwards. "Some are here just to have a good time and socialize with other kids from around the state, while others get very serious about the competition aspect. We had several shooters who will be going to college next year on full-ride scholarships to compete on a collegiate level in the shotgun sports." He added, "These outstanding youth along with their dedicated coaches show that not only is Missouri a great place to hunt and fish, but a great place to enjoy shooting sports too!"

The team of Timber Ballantyne, Brandon Bothwell, Ben Burtch, Matt Dupy, and Zach Quinn placed 6th in the State FFA Shoot. As a team, they shot 460 out of 500. Other students that participated on an individual basis were Brady Bothwell. This year the coaching staff consisted of Sarge Ralls and Tony Burtch.

The student scores were Timber Ballantyne 91 out of 100, Brady Bothwell 81 out of 100, Brandon Bothwell 95 out of 100, Ben Burtch 98 out of 100, Matt Dupy 81 of 100, and Zach Quinn 96 out of 100. The objectives of the program are to involve students in the highest standards of safety, sportsmanship, and ethical behavior, along with safe and responsible use of firearms. Also, the program helps to develop self-confidence, personal discipline, sportsmanship, and teamwork.

## State FFA Model of Innovation Award Winner in the Student Division

The Chillicothe FFA Chapter was selected as the 2014 Model of Innovation - Student Development award by the Missouri FFA Organization. Student Development serves as one of three FFA Model of Innovation award areas geared to drive complete development of an FFA chapter.

The Chillicothe FFA Chapter became eligible for the award after earning a Three-Star rating during state chapter judging completed by FFA during the 86th Missouri FFA Convention. There, judges evaluate a chapter's Program of Activities (POA) that contains activities specified by three standing chapter committees which are to be accomplished during the course of a school year. Each of the 334 FFA chapters statewide are required to develop a POA specific to their needs and goals.

The three key programs developed by the members of the Chillicothe FFA Chapter were to assist our members in their journey to beging responsible adults. The three programs are Voices of Agriculture, Going for the Gold, and SAE on Display. Voices of Agriculture is designed to help all of our chapter members gain experience in public speaking, whether it be as simple as saying the FFA Creed to the class or becoming a state winning public speaker. Going for the Gold is designed to help our chapter members financially with school or SAE projects through scholarships and awards. SAE on Display is designed to help our chapter members let the public know what an SAE is and how it is important to them. Overall, the chapter created over 15 exceptional activities during the school year related to quality standards set by the National FFA Organization.

Also during the 86th Missouri State FFA Convention, the Chillicothe FFA Chapter was awarded three top honors. Those awards given to the chapter were Superior Chapter, 100% Membership, and Gold Emblem Awards.

The Chillicothe FFA Chapter placed 6th out of 334 chapters in the state of Missouri with their Gold Emblem Award. Only 10 percent of state chapters receive a top chapter designation each year. To qualify for the Superior Chapter Activity Award, chapters must verify that their chapter members have completed at least one activity related to each of the five quality standards established within the three divisions: Student, Chapter and Community development. The 100% Membership Award is given to those chapters who have a chapter membership roster that is equal to or greater than the number of members of 9-12 students enrolled in the schools Ag Education courses. The Gold emblem award is for chapters that completed and submitted a National Chapter Application on the state level. Selection is bases on major activities described in Form II of the National Chapter Activity Award Application. The top chapters are submitted to the National FFA Organization where they compete for the National FFA Chapter Award. The competition will be this fall at the National FFA Convention in Louisville, KY.

The FFA makes a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success through agricultural education.

On April 24, 2014 at the Missouri State FFA Convention, Brandon Bothwell received 1st place in the Grain Production Entrepreneurship Proficiency Award. Bothwell will now advance to the national level and compete at the National FFA Convention in Louisville, KY in October 2014.

### **State FFA Degrees**

April 25, 2014

On March 3, 2014 it was announced that fourteen members of the Chillicothe FFA will be receiving their State FFA Degree in Columbia, MO on April 25, 2014. Before receiving this degree they had to meet a number of qualifications and fill out an application that followed their SAE and leadership skills. The State FFA Degree is the highest degree that the Missouri FFA Association can give to its members. This degree is awarded to the top three percent of the total State FFA membership each year who have met the following qualifications:

- Have received the Chapter FFA Degree and have been an active FFA member for at least two years (24 months) at the time of receiving the State FFA Degree.
- While in high school, have completed the equivalent of at least two years (360 hours) of systematic school instruction in agriculture education at or above the ninth grade level which includes a supervised agriculture experience program.
- Have earned and productively invested at least \$1000 or worked at least 300 hours in excess of scheduled class time, or combination thereof in a supervised agricultural experience program.
- Demonstrate leadership ability by:
  - a. Performing 10 parliamentary procedures of parliamentary law.
  - b. Giving a six-minute speech on a topic related to agriculture or the FFA.
  - c. Serving as an officer and/or committee chairperson or a participating member of a chapter committee
  - d. Making a satisfactory score on a written test on FFA.
- Show outstanding leadership participation in chapter activities and school and community activities by:
  - a. Participating in planning and conducting chapter program of activities.
  - b. Serving as chapter officer or committee chairperson.
  - c. Participating in at least 5 activities above the chapter level.
  - d. Participating in leadership positions outside the FFA.
  - e. Scoring a minimum of 150 points on the Leadership Section of the State FFA Degree application.
- Have a satisfactory scholastic record, certified by the local superintendent or principal.


The students are busy gearing up for a plant sale which will be held at the school greenhouse on April 29, 30, and May 1, 2014 from 2:30 to 5:00 pm.

Chillicothe FFA Chapter has chosen for their Agriculture Issues forum, "Should Horse Slaughtering be banned in the United States?" For decades, Americans have not accepted the fact the horses can be slaughtered for meat purposes. Even to this day, the debate continues as to whether horses are considered livestock or companion animals. This debate in recent years has taken center stage in not only the agriculture community, but among horse-lovers everywhere. The debate has made its way to Washington; and for the last eight years, Congress has debated a Horse Slaughter Prevention Act. However, more recently, in our surrounding community, this debate has added repercussions. Dave Rains, of Rain's Natural Meats of Gallatin, Missouri, built a slaughtering facility on the corner of his farm to process naturally-raised beef and pork. When big companies saturated that marketplace, he applied for a permit to butcher horses. He expected to be in business this time last year. However, a lawsuit, backed by the Humane Society, now stands between Mr. Rains and a state permit.



The Agriculture Issues Forum team has also present previously to the Livingston County Farm Bureau Board, the Chillicothe Agri-Leaders, Chillicothe Rotary, Chillicothe R-II School Board, and Chillicothe Chamber of Commerce. The team received first place at the area level and first place at the district level. The team will compete at the state level in Columbia, Missouri on April 24, 2014.

# Missouri Ag Skills & Knowledge Event

March 20, 2014

On March 20, 2014, the North Central Missouri College was host to a MOASK event. There were 82 students from the Litton Agriculture Campus attending the event as well as approximately 1800 students from all over Missouri. Students completed skills assessments on the agriculture subjects of farm management, horse evaluation, poultry, meats, forestry, agronomy, entomology, soils, dairy cattle evaluation, and dairy products. These events are held to demonstrate knowledge and skill, improve the transition from secondary to post-secondary forms of education, and convey proof of skill mastery to potential employers.

The Office of College and Career Readiness implemented a plan that meets the requirements of the Perkins IV Act requiring Career Education students completing a program of study to be assessed for Technical Skill Attainment. At this time, all students completing a program of study are required to take a Technical Skill Assessment. As this program has evolved and with the implementation of MSIP 5 Standards, the Missouri Farm Bureau Federation has partnered with the Missouri Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources Education section to implement the Missouri Agricultural Skills and Knowledge (MOASK) Industry Recognized Credential (IRC) program. MOASK IRC accomplishes two purposes: 1) Provides for credentialing of students performing at proficient levels on Industry Recognized assessments and 2) Meets Technical Skill Assessment requirements for completers of a program of study.

According to the MSIP 5 Guidelines, an Industry Recognized Credential is a certificate awarded to a student that has completed the required education/training and demonstrated accomplishment of the intended learning outcomes recognized by industry. This industry related certificate must be renewable or stackable through continuing education, apprenticeships, or on-the-job training/work experience. The MOASK IRC meets these requirements, as it is industry related and is stackable as part of a sequence of credentials that can be accumulated over time to build up an individual's gualifications and help them

move along their career pathway. Students will be able to receive stackable Industry Recognized Credentials by taking multiple assessments in one pathway or by taking assessments in multiple pathways.


# **8TH GRADE RECRUITMENT**





# National FFA Agriscience Fair - Haley Places 10th

LOUISVILLE- Lauren Haley of Chillicothe, MO recently competed in the National FFA Agriscience Fair. Lauren Haley was awarded with a Gold medal in honor of her 10th place project in the Animal Science Advanced Division section titled: *The Effect of Weaning Age on Feed Consumption and Rate of Gain in Goat Kids*. Lauren Haley placed 1st at the state level before moving onto the National FFA Agri-Science Fair. Participants received ribbons along with their medals and were honored at a banquet at the National FFA Convention, October 20 - November 2, in Louisville, KY.



Lauren's abstract to her Agriscience project is as follows: The purpose of this experiment was to study the effect of weaning age on feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. Weaning can be a management practice that will affect the profit of the producer. Weaning allows the producer to control the feed intake of his animal and evaluate the growth of the animal as well. People use varying guidelines as they make decisions about weaning. Some use the standard 90 day age while others wean earlier or use weight to determine when to wean. The control in this experiment was 90 day weaning, traditionally the time when

kids are weaned. This experiment was done on thirty nine goat kids in the same environment, vaccination history, and feeding program prior to the experiment. The independent variable in this experiment was weaning age. The dependent variables in this experiment were feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. The amount of feed consumed by each group was measured each day and then added together to determine the total amount of feed consumption over a seven week period from the age of 55 days to 90 days. Each kid was weighed when they turned 60 and 90 days old to determine their rate of gain. The results in this experiment showed that weaning age does have an impact on feed consumption and rate of gain in goat kids. The 60 day weaning group had the highest feed consumption while the control (90 day) weaning group had the lowest. The control (90 day) weaning group had the highest rate of gain while the 75 day weaning group had the lowest. The results show that the hypothesis was supported by comparing the 60 day and control (90 day) weaning groups and the 75 day and control (90 day) weaning groups. The hypothesis was not supported when comparing the 60 and 75 day weaning groups. The null hypothesis stating total feed consumption and rate of gain will not be significantly different between weaning groups must be accepted when comparing groups 60 day and 75 day weaning, but can be rejected when comparing groups 60 day and control (90 day) weaning and 75 day and control (90 day) weaning. Recommendations for further study would be to study earlier and later weaning ages. The effect of gender as it relates to weaning could also be studied.

The agriscience fair program is sponsored by Cargill and Syngenta as a special project of the National FFA Foundation, which includes cash awards.

Have earned and productively invested at least \$7,500, or have earned and productively invested at least \$1,500 and worked 2,250 hours beyond scheduled school hours through their SAEs. Have a record of outstanding leadership skills. Have a record of participating in community service activities. Have maintained a "C" grade average or better.

#### Greenhouse Class - Fall Plant Sale

1st Semester 2013-2014

Students from Mr. Wolf's Greenhouse class at the Litton Agriculture Education Center were preparing for the fall plant sale. The students were learning about basic plant science as well as plant reproduction. Different types of plant reproduction the students are learning about are: planting from seeds, using plugs, and utilizing cuttings. During the semester, students will have learned more about how a greenhouse works and how good nutrition and access to water affects plants at the Litton Agri-Science Learning Center.



The students are transplanting Cyclamen plugs into larger pots in order for them to be ready for sale around the first of December. Cyclamen is a tender plant that flowers during the winter. The plants are typically 6 to 16 inches tall with a mounded habit. The heart-shaped leaves are variegated. Their coloring is green with grey to silver mottling. The waxy flowers appear atop stalks several inches above the foliage and have an appearance similar to an orchid. Single, double, fringed, crested and frilled flower forms are available in colors ranging from white to pink, rose, red or purple. The flowers last approximately six weeks.
