The scholarship will total \$200. It is given in memory of Lee Fitchett a past Agriculture Instructor and Assistant Director at Grand River Technical School


CHARLES SURBER AWARD


Selection guidelines include FFA participation, willingness to exhibit at local and area fairs, scholarship, and interest/goals for their livestock project.


